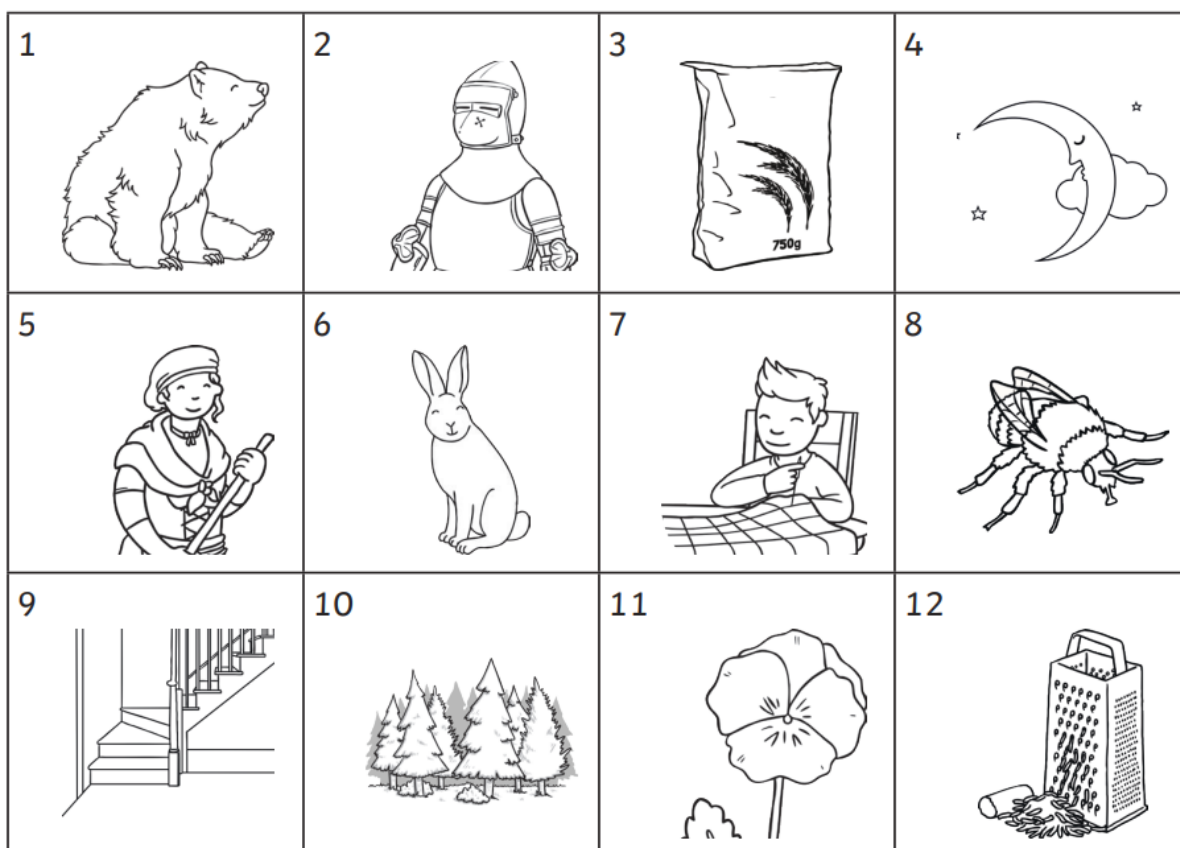


Homophones
